## **Ripon Society & Franklin Center Honor the "Unsung Heroes of Capitol Hill" with 13th Annual Bipartisan Luncheon**

WASHINGTON, DC - The Ripon Society and The Franklin Center for Global Policy Exchange held their 13th annual bipartisan luncheon honoring the Operations Directors and Schedulers in the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate this past Friday. These staff members, as described by Ripon and Franklin President & CEO Jim Conzelman, "play an indispensable role in ensuring the smooth functioning of Congress."

"Every day, despite countless requests and an ever-changing agenda, the Schedulers and Executive Assistants in the House and Senate make the impossible happen," Conzelman shared in his opening remarks. "This marks the 13th year we've gathered to honor this hardworking group of Congressional staff members, whom we refer to as the 'Unsung Heroes of Capitol Hill.'

"Your work often goes unappreciated, but it has not gone unnoticed. Both Congress and the nation are better because of everything you do. You are integral to keeping Congress running and the democratic process alive, and we owe you our deepest gratitude."
